Letter from the President

Welcome to the first newsletter from the new Executive. I am very glad to see that we are making a fresh effort to keep residents informed of current RFS issues. Thanks to Tim and Kim Gow for driving this project.

Commonwealth Government Small Equipment Grants

I am pleased to tell you that we have been awarded a grant from the Commonwealth government for \$1,900 to cover the cost of purchasing a stretcher, back-pack blower and a back-pack slasher. The stretcher will be used for rescues, and the blower and slasher help with ground clearing in hazard reductions. These new pieces of equipment will assist the work of the Brigade and we are grateful for the grant.

Water Tanks

As you were advised at the AGM, the four community tanks situated on Council land have all been approved and the last one should be installed in Farrer Road West by September. We have prepared a Review of Environmental Factors for the tank near Danes Way and submitted it to the National Parks & Wildlife Service for their comments. This document takes the place of a Development Application for a tank on NPWS land. After initial comments we must then submit the document to NPWS headquarters for final approval.

Community Education

We hope this year to accelerate the community education process by appointing Street Wardens to act as communication officers during a fire situation. A planned letterbox drop will provide you with leaflets and maps outlining preparation and action during a fire.

Planning For Summer

It is never too early to plan for summer, so remember to clear flammable material away from your house, keep the gutters clear and check that your portable bush fire pump is working. If you don't yet have a bush-fire pump (non-electric), now would be a good time to buy one. Barry Freeman or Peter Raines can advise you on the best type.

The Brigade is computerising the membership and training records and need all members who have undergone training of any sort to either -


copy their Course certificates and/or

Early Fire Season

2004-2005 FIRE SEASON

The Commissioner for the NSW Rural Fire Service, Phil Koperberg has declared the start of the Fire Season to be Sunday 1stst August. This declaration has become necessary due to the prolonged dry conditions and the current Bureau of Meteorology weather forecast for the next 3 months. With the low soil moisture, low water table and amount of fuel in the bush, we would need in excess of 180mm just to bring us back to average conditions.

As indicated at the recent AGM, we need to prepare ourselves as a Community, for a bad Fire Season. To this end the Brigade will be focusing on Community Education and Property Preparation in this coming year. Your President, David Howell together with Ross Kelly (Mt.Irvine) and Brian Abrahams (Mt.Wilson) will be working with residents to form

area/street 'FireWise Groups''.
Please give them your assistance and co-operation when contacted.

Each property owner should be well down the track in preparing their properties through hazard reduction, pile burns and ensuring access into your property and along fence lines for Fire Trucks.

From the lstst August, *ALL BURNING* will require Fire Permits. Application forms are available from the container on the verandah of the Mt. Wilson Fire Station. These permit applications must be submitted by post or fax to the Blue Mountains RFS Control Centre in Katoomba.

Property owners should not 'panic burn' in the lead up to 1st August, just to avoid having to get a permit. If you prepare properly and meet the requirements stipulated, permission

will not be withheld. Permits will be issued by the RFS and **not** BMCC.

Many recent fires that the RFS has attended, have been burnoffs that got out of control in windy conditions. If you are in doubt, don't! If you want advice please talk with either myself or Peter Raines.

In the coming months this Brigade will still be trying to do our Prescribed Burns, and we will notify all residents affected or in the area concerned, at least 24 hours beforehand.

Even though the current weather is cold and not conducive to ignition at our elevation, please stay vigilant and continue your property preparation.
