OUTLOOK FOR 2007/2008 FIRE SEASON

The outlook for the 2007/2008 fire season is uncertain at this stage. There is a weak la Nina weather system in place (the wet one) but we could get long spells of dry weather. The likelihood of a severe fire season is 50:50. It is imperative that you take the necessary steps to prepare your property for the fire season. Fire preparation will make it a lot safer for our crews to operate on your property and increase the chances of your property surviving a bushfire.

What should you do to prepare your property?

- 1. Prepare your house and other buildings against ember attack.
- 2. Ensure that you a fuel reduced zone around your house and sheds
- 3. Construct a firebreak around your property
- 4. Have fire fighting equipment and water ready
- 5. Have a bushfire action plan for your property
- 6. Make a check list of things to be done as fire approaches

TOTAL FIRE BANS

During a Total Fire Ban, outdoor cooking may only be done using a gas or electric BBQ, provided it is within 20m of a residential dwelling, under the immediate supervision of an adult, in a cleared area and there is running water available nearby.

Fireworks (including sparklers), wood or charcoal BBQs and candles (whether enclosed or not) are among the items **not** permitted to be used outside. Where applied for, special Total Fire Ban Exemptions <u>may</u> be provided for such activities as Carols and other religious or cultural observances, by applying to the Rural Fire Service on 1800 679 737. Lighting a fire on a day of Total Fire Ban attracts a fine of up to \$5,500 and/or 12 months gaol.

Penalties for a fire that escapes and damages or destroys life, property or the environment can attract much greater fines and gaol terms with maximums at \$100,000 and/or 14 years.

How will you know if a Total Fire Ban is declared?

Check the RFS website (www.rfs.nsw.gov.au) Current Fire Danger Map or call 1800 NSW RFS (1800 679 737), or the local RFS Fire Control Centre. Announcements are also made in newspapers, on the radio and on television. You need to know what NSW Fire Area you are in to determine if a Total Fire Ban applies to you.

You can check this on the Current Fire Danger Map on the RFS website. Mt Wilson and Mt Irvine's NSW Fire Area is Greater Sydney Region (4). Click on this area and the name of Blue Mountains Council will appear on the right hand side of the map. You can then check if a Total Fire Ban applies to your area.
