Originally from the Mid North Coast of New South Wales and now living in Queensland for the past 25 years, she has been practicing art just outside of Brisbane in her home studio and Queenslander cottage.

She holds a Bachelor of Photography from Griffith University, Queensland College of Art, where she studied art theory and majored in photographic art practice and holds a Graduate Certificate in Museum Studies from Deakin University. She established the SWICH Contemporary Art Space with her partner, where she was the Gallery Director/Curator, and is now a Gallery Coordinator for Toowoomba Regional Council, and a freelance curator and photographer. She has exhibited for the past 15 years in solo and group exhibitions, has achieved several awards, and her work is held in public and private collections.
